Interpreters share the story of the Okanagan River's Sockeye salmon's 6000-km journey to the ocean and back

September 30, 2025- Did you know that the Okanagan River is the only remaining British Columbia Sockeye Salmon Spawning grounds in the Columbia watershed? Join interpreter Lee McFadyen to learn about the many salmon spawning enhancement projects along the Okanagan River and the fascinating life cycle of ocean-going fish. After the 2024 record Okanagan run, the 2025 run is naturally smaller, and further reduced by overly warm water temperatures. The successful return of the sockeye from near extirpation numbers to current healthy numbers, is a direct result of the ONA initiatives.

The Okanagan Similkameen Conservation Alliance (OSCA) and the Okanagan Nation Alliance are hosting two "Celebrate Our Salmon" open houses along the Okanagan River. The first open house is Saturday, October 11th 10am -12pm at the Okanagan River Restoration Initiative site just North of Oliver. The second open house will also be on Saturday, October 11th 1:30pm-3:30pm in Penticton at the newly completed Okanagan Lake Fish Passage on the east side of the Dam at the south outlet of Okanagan Lake.

Everyone is invited to celebrate the sockeye salmon returning after their challenging 6000-kilometre journey to the ocean and back.
